

Stop a Scottish coal mine - before it starts

Australian company, NAE Ltd, intend to start a new underground coal mine near Gretna on the Scottish border. The company proposes to extract a massive **33.7 million tonnes of coal between 2025 and 2051**, for sale to steelworks abroad, and also in England.

The coal mine itself would release around **750,000 tonnes of methane**, a powerful climate change accelerant, and roughly **73 million tonnes of CO2** when the coal is used.

Coal Action Network is looking for concerned people to fight with us against this application when it goes through the planning system. A planning application is expected shortly. The last Scottish coal mine closed in 2013 because of community protests and campaigns at planning meetings, lower coal prices, fewer investments, and direct action.





This is one of four applications for new coal mines in the UK. These applications risk a dangerous revival of an industry that threatens all our futures. For the sake of our environment, local people, and biodiversity, we need to keep all coal in the ground.
